WARNING SIGNS

- Unexplainable behavior and mood swings
- Secretiveness
- Loss of interest in daily activities
- General changes in overall attitude
- Physical decline
- Has unexplained money or constantly needs money
- Receives phone calls (often short ones) at odd hours of the night
- Lies about activities
- Withdrawal from responsibility
- Always keeps jacket on
- Physical evidence of drugs such as: rolling papers, seeds, clips, spoons, cotton balls, syringes, etc.
- Use of cover-ups like: mouth spray, eye drops, perfume, etc.
